Open syllables

When the long (u) sound comes at the **end of a syllable** within a word, it is usually represented by the letter u on its own.

Remember: Say the word aloud, then say each letter aloud **as you write it** e.g. 'human, h ... u ... m ... a ... n'



Each person is a **human (hu/man)**.

human human



A **pupil (pu/pil)** is a child at school.

pupil pupil



If someone is **stupid (stu/pid)**, they are not very clever.

stupid stupid



A **unit (u/nit)** is just one.

unit unit



In **music (mu/sic)** you learn to sing and play instruments.

music music



A **student (stu/dent)** is a person at university or college.

student student



A **tulip (tu/lip)** is a type of flower.

tulip tulip



If you **educate (ed/u/cate)** someone, you teach them.

educate educate



A **menu (men/u)** tells you what you can eat in a restaurant.

menu menu
